STEPHANIE STREET, One of Many Special Volunteers

Stephanie Street is pleasant, quiet and can even appear shy and timid. But don't let the exterior fool you. Stephanie is strong, focused, astute and very perceptive.

In 2007 Stephanie saw a CASA ad featuring a young man in need of an advocate, so she signed up for CASA training because she "loves working with young people." Her assignment was that of a 13 year old young man who had been in care for much of his youth.

Stephanie has worked with this youth for over six years and has been a steadfast, supportive, and consistent advocate. One has to admire her determination to not give up on her CASA youth. She has been such a great influence on him, as over the years she has established a very trusting and cumulative relationship. She has been there through the good times and the bad times, the disappointments, the hurt, and the successes. She was there for the young man's high school graduation, when he was terminated from his first independent living program, when relatives made empty promises, and when he starred as the leading role in a play. He is currently out of State in training for the National Guard Reserve. Stephanie should be credited with encouraging her CASA youth to do something constructive with his life.

Her CASA youth once said to her, "You are like a mother, always there". What

a testimony to a caring advocate! Stephanie says that it's important to "help people...mentor your children and guide them". Stephanie explained that "as my CASA youth matured and grew, I grew also."

Stephanie has a variety of interests and endeavors that keep her very busy. Stephanie is a mother and grandmother of four. She is an active member of Huber Memorial Church and a graduate of WEB, Women Entrepreneurs of Baltimore. In June 2013 Stephanie will graduate from the Bible School of the Bible. Most importantly, Stephanie is a 25 year breast cancer survivor and an active member of the support group, Sisters Networking, Baltimore Metropolitan Chapter. One of her goals is to have her own business. Stephanie is steadfast and moving forward.
